

## Mark 14 Questions

Read Mark 14:1-11

As the disciples point out, there was no utility in the woman's offering. Why did Jesus praise her?

How might the woman's offering be a model to us--how can we likewise do beautiful things for Jesus?  
How might we cultivate our hearts so that we love him like she did?

Read Mark 14:12-25

What is the significance of the Lord's supper happening during Passover?

What do the statements "this is my body" and "this is my blood" imply?

Other accounts of Jesus' words have him saying "do this in remembrance of me." What good is it for Christians to remember this--we've already placed our faith in him, right?

It seems like it could get boring to remember that same thing over and over again, but Jesus probably didn't have tedium in mind. How can we remember it frequently without getting bored?

Read Mark 14:32-42

Why do you think Jesus was in such distress and sorrow?

The Bible tells us to rejoice in our tribulations, to not be anxious or worried about our lives, and that God supplies peace "that surpasses all understanding." Is Jesus setting a negative example for us in his distress? If not, then how do we understand the Bible's commands in light of Jesus' distress?

What is Jesus praying for? What is one situation in your life right now where his prayer is a good model for you?

What were the disciples supposed to be watching? What's so wrong about napping when you're tired?

What lessons we can learn from the disciples' behavior and Jesus' rebuke of them?
